



NBCC moved to self-governance with the proclamation of the *New Brunswick Community Colleges Act* on May 29, 2010. Since that time, the Board of Governors became the governing body of the College. The new governance model has created an autonomous Crown Corporation with a President and CEO who, on behalf of the six Anglophone NBCC campuses, reports to the Board of Governors.

Depending on your field of study, college programs begin with classroom-based lessons and labs. Your class sizes will be small, and taught by industry professionals.
